The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB) is recognised by the world's leading universities. It's a popular choice for international students seeking university entry and an Australian study experience.

The challenging pre-university program requires a 2-year commitment from you in Years 11 and 12 **OR** 3 years if you study through the Queensland Academies where the preparation for IB in Year 10 is mandatory.

## **Entry requirements**

#### **Queensland Government high school applications**

To enrol in the IB for Years 11 and 12, you must show us that you have achieved a high level of success in your academic results during the previous 2 years of study.



Demonstrate a high level of English ability by submitting an approved English language test result or provide evidence of secondary school studies that have been taught in English for a minimum of 2 years.

Applications for Queensland Academies are only through a selective entry enrolment process.

A successful Year 10 applicant will demonstrate:

- > academic ability across a range of subjects
- > a high level of commitment and application to study
- > high standards of personal behaviour
- > commitment to personal and social development
- > a sense of citizenship displayed through care and concern for others.

Submit an online application through the Queensland Academies Portal https://qa.eq.edu.au/enrolments/year10-enrolments/year10-application-process.

Applicants sit the Edutest entrance test on a scheduled date.

Selected students will be invited to participate in an interview.

Applicants receive a letter of outcome.

## The IB fees

Fees apply to enrol in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Don't forget you will need to pay additional fees for school uniforms, homestay, excursions and tours.

## Application and start dates

Different application cut-off dates apply, depending on when you want to start studying in Queensland. You must apply before these cut-off dates for your application to be considered. The start months for our IB students are:

- > January for the Queensland Academies 3-year program from Year 10.
- > January for the 2-year program in other high schools in Years 11 and 12.
- > January or July for 6 months or 1 year for an IB study abroad component.

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The IB is an internationally recognised qualification for high achievers who are ready to commit two years in Year 11 and 12 for an outstanding global qualification in preparation for university.

The IB curriculum aims to develop skills in critical thinking, communication, selfmanagement, teamwork and research in preparation for university.

It is one of the world's most innovative educational courses offered for 16 to 18-year olds and is globally recognised by universities for the holistic and rigorous education it provides.

The IB fulfils national and state education system requirements and lets students transfer from a Queensland IB school to any other IB school in the world.

Did you know the IB also works in reverse? If you are studying an IB in your home country, you could spend six months or a year here in Queensland, experiencing an Aussie lifestyle and then return to your school for the final part. The great news is that you receive the full IB qualification from your home-country school.

### Introduction to the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program subjects

Over the course of the IB, Year 11 and Year 12, six subjects are chosen. These are usually three subjects (and not more than four) at higher level (HL) and the others are taken at standard level (SL). In addition, there are three compulsory core elements—the extended essay, theory of knowledge and creativity, activity, service—that are central to the philosophy of the program.

These subject offerings may vary from year to year. The following subjects are offered for Term 1, 2024.
