# Our primary school program

#### PS Primary School (CRICOS Course Code: 082519A)

Our Primary School program gives young students a positive start to their early development and learning.



Local Australian children start school at 5 years old but our international students must be 6 years old on the day they start school.

All students from a non-English speaking background receive specialist English as an Additional Language/ Dialect (EAL/D) lessons so they can participate in classroom and extracurricular activities.

Primary school provides a strong foundation for future study.

International primary school students must hold a student visa (500)\* to start an EQI International Student Program.

International students enrolled in primary school must stay with a parent or a Department of Home Affairs approved relative.

To be eligible for this student visa, international students must be 6 years of age or older.
