## Subclass 500 (schools) student fees

Education Queensland International (EQI) charges fees for overseas students which include both tuition and non-tuition fees available here - <u>https://eqi.com.au/apply-now/fees</u>.

## **Tuition fees include:**

- the cost levied by the school to access the Information Technology (IT) device used by the school and access to the school IT infrastructure (approx. \$200)
- all aspects of compulsory schooling and teaching costs
- textbook purchase or hire and subject levies
- compulsory subject-related excursions
- supervision and counselling (academic and personal) throughout your program abroad
- enrolment in a Queensland Government school
- pre-departure and post-arrival orientation information
- English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) support
- International Baccalaureate Diploma fees (if applicable)

## Non-tuition fees include:

- Overseas Student Health Cover (if arranged by EQI)
- student identification card
- student planner (if compulsory)
- support of a school International Student Coordinator and/or Homestay Coordinator
- management of homestay fees (if applicable)
- homestay placement and airport pickup (if applicable)
- homestay accommodation and 3 meals per day (if applicable)

## Items not covered by fees paid to EQI:

- school uniforms (please refer to the relevant school website for more details)
- school activities or special events that are not compulsory, such as optional excursions, school formal or graduation ceremony and performances
- personal items
- stationery
- travel costs to and from school
- lunch at school
- musical instruments
- student yearbook
- additional food that is over and above standard meals
- passport and visa application fees
- international and domestic travel
- school camps
- airport pick up and drop off when returning home for holiday or on completion of your course
- additional fees relating to specialist subjects/courses and activities depending on the subjects selected.
